# Message from our Executive Director



Since its founding in 1991, Living Green Barrie has been dedicated to making our city cleaner and greener. I joined the organization in 2019, and with the support of our Board of Directors, we've focused on sustainable growth and building a strong environmental presence to serve Barrie residents.

Barrie's population has grown from 62,728 in 1991 to nearly 160,000 today. In 2019, City Council declared a climate emergency, highlighting the urgent need for action. Forgive the tired cliché, but "now, more than ever," we need a powerful environmental voice.

This 2024 Annual Report highlights our progress over the past five years. We've achieved much with limited resources, but this is just the beginning.

Despite not having a physical location, we've delivered impactful educational programs. Without core funding or specialized staff, we've rebuilt from the ground up. And though we lack a planting truck or tree nursery, we've already planted 5,560 native trees and shrubs toward our 10,000 Trees for Barrie goal. What we lack in resources, we make up for in creativity and an optimistic belief in what should and could be!

Our success is due to amazing volunteers, passionate Board Members, and the dedication of hardworking staff - Sarah (currently home with baby Grace) and Kerry.

I'm excited about our future and confident that, with the continued support of our community, businesses and individuals, we can achieve even greater impact.

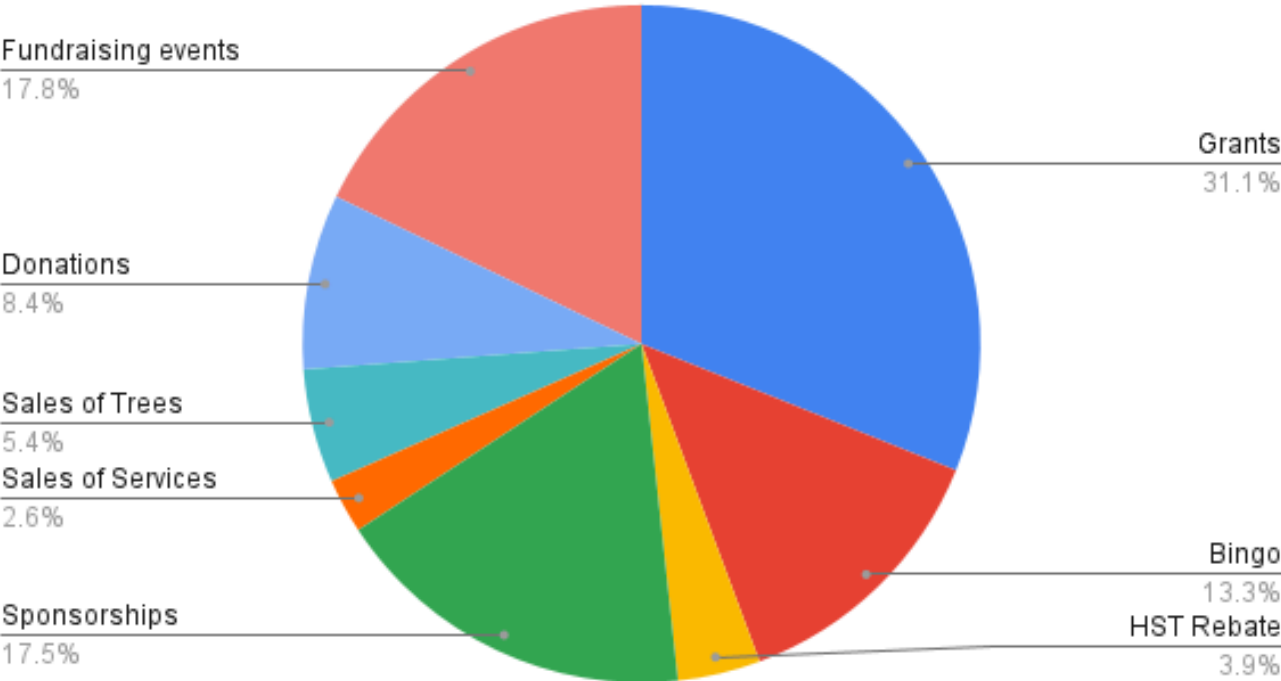

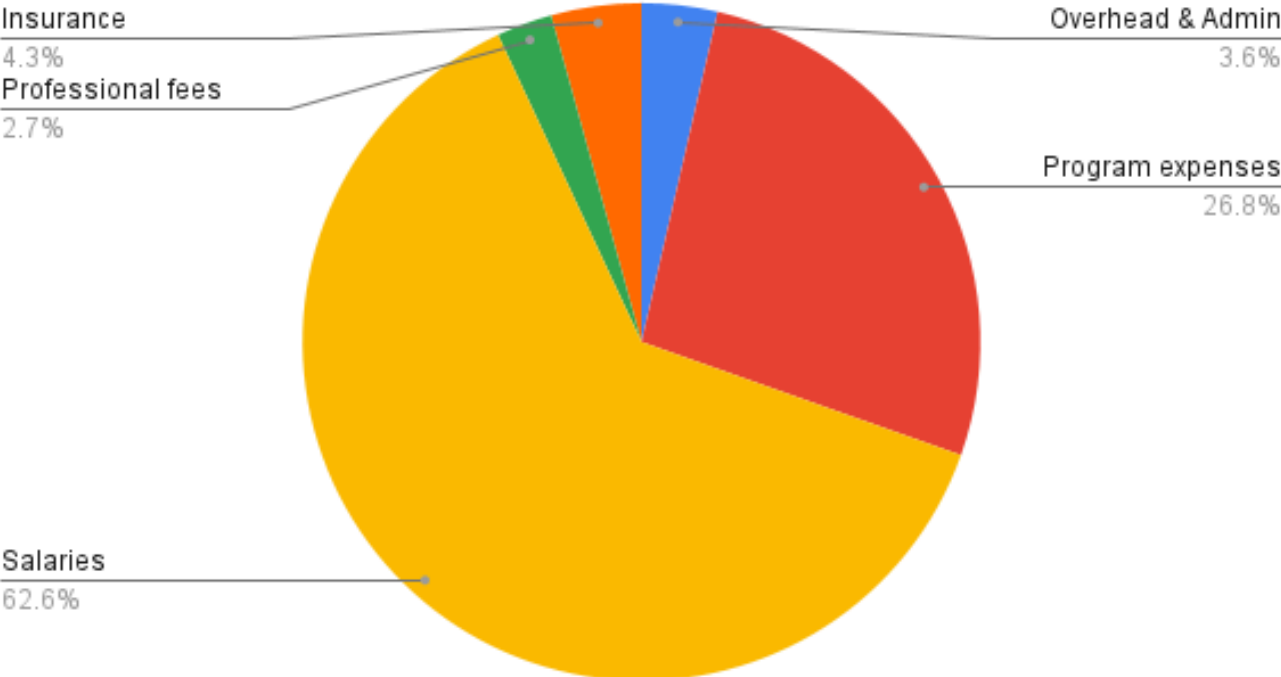

## What does this mean?

Living Green Barrie is on a significant upward trajectory. Over the past 5 years, we have done a great deal with very little resources. Living Green has no consistent source of base-level funding but has increased fundraising efforts and social enterprise initiatives. Two significant grants (2023, 2024) changed our pathway and offered hope that this charity will continue to fulfil its mission. These grants, which ended in June 2024, comprised over 30% of annual revenue and allowed staff to be retained. Staff do the vast majority of program work. Without new investments and grants, Living Green may not continue to staff our programs.

However, Living Green has persisted in some form for over 3 decades. This beloved organization has credibility, longevity, and is Barrie's only registered environmental charity. Further, it has received significant support recently from individuals and businesses who believe in this plucky, creative underdog.
